Plaintiff, UNICOLORS, INC., a California corporation,
 for its complaint against all Defendants named herein,
 alleges as follows:

THE PARTIES

1. Plaintiff, UNICOLORS, INC., (hereafter
 "UNICOLORS") was, and now is, a corporation duly organized
 and existing under the laws of the State of California,
 with its principal place of business located at Los
 Angeles, California.

2. On information and belief, UNICOLORS alleges that

1 Defendant, SILHOUETTE CLOTHING, INC., (hereafter
2 "SILHOUETTE") was, and now is, a corporation duly organized
3 and existing under the laws of the State of California,
4 with its principal place of business located at Los
5 Angeles, California, and was at all times herein licensed
6 to due business in the State of California.

7 3. On information and belief, UNICOLORS alleges that
8 Defendant, JANETTE FASHION, (hereafter "JANETTE") was, and
9 now is, a business entity form unknown existing under the
10 laws of the State of California, with its principal place
11 of business located at Los Angeles, California, and was at
12 all times herein licensed to due business in the State of
13 California.

14 JURISDICTION AND VENUE

15 4. This action arises under the Act of October 19,
16 1976, Title I Section 101, 90 Stat. 2541; 17 U.S.C. Section
17 501; and this Court has jurisdiction under the Act of June
18 25, 1948, c. 646, 62 Stat. 931; 28 U.S.C. Section 1338, as
19 hereinafter more fully appears.

20 5. This action arises under the Copyright Laws of
21 the United States, 17 U.S.C. 101, et seq. and,
22 particularly, under 17 U.S.C. 106, 501, and to redress the
23 infringements of copyrights. This Court has jurisdiction
24 over the subject matter of this claim pursuant to 28 U.S.C.
25 1331.

26 6. Venue properly lies in this Judicial District
27 pursuant to 28 U.S.C. Section 1400(-) and 28 U.S.C. Section
28

1 1391(b). Process properly issues from this Court pursuant
2 to Rule 4 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure.

3 7. Prior to October 20, 2006, UNICOLORS who then was
4 and ever since has been a citizen of the United States,
5 created and designed original works of art reproduced in

6 printed fabric designs, one of which is the subject of this
7 Action, designated by UNICOLORS by its design number
8 609236, (hereafter "the Design", or "Design").

9 8. The Design is wholly original with UNICOLORS and
10 is capable of being copyrighted subject matter under the
11 laws of the United States.

12 9. Between October 20, 2006 and the present date,
13 UNICOLORS complied in all respects with the Act of October
14 19, 1976, Title I Section 101, 90 Stat. 2541; 17 U.S.C.
15 Section 401-412 and all other laws governing copyright and
16 secured the exclusive rights and privileges in and to the
17 copyright of the Design.

18 10. The work of art comprising the Design was and is
19 wholly original and is copyrightable subject matter under
20 the laws of the United States. UNICOLORS has validly
21 secured statutory copyright in the Design under the laws of
22 the United States.

23 11. UNICOLORS has duly complied in all respects with
24 the provisions of the Copyright Law of the United States,
25 and has secured the exclusive rights and privileges in and
26 to the Design, and UNICOLORS thereupon duly requested and
27 received from the Register of Copyrights, Certificate of

1 Registration Number VA 1-388-723. (A true and correct copy
2 of the Copyright Registration for the Design is attached
3 hereto as Exhibit "1", and is incorporated herein by this
4 reference.)

5 12. All copies of the Design have been published by
6 only UNICOLORS, and all copies have been printed,
7 reproduced, and published in strict conformity with the
8 provisions of the Copyright Law of the United States.

9 13. At all relevant times since creation of the
10 Design, UNICOLORS has been, and is now, the sole proprietor
11 of all right, title, and interest in the copyright and the
12 right to exploit the copyright of the exclusive Design.

13 14. Pursuant to UNICOLORS' sole and exclusive right
14 in the Design, UNICOLORS commenced to print and convert
15 fabric goods into printed textiles for use in the
16 manufacture of apparel and other purposes bearing imprints
17 of said copyrighted Design and UNICOLORS has sold such
18 materials and textiles bearing the Design.

19 15. SILHOUETTE, and DOES 1 through 3, upon
20 information and belief, is retail distributor of apparel,
21 and has sold in the United States and within this judicial
22 district, apparel which infringes UNICOLORS' copyright in
23 the Design as set forth hereinafter.

24 16. JANETTE, and DOES 4 through 10, and each of them,
25 upon information and belief, is a manufacturer of, among
26 other things, apparel, and has manufactured and sold in the
27 United States and within this district apparel which
28

1 infringes UNICOLORS' copyright in the Design as set forth
2 hereinafter.

3 17. SILHOUETTE, JANETTE, and DOES 1 through 10, and
4 their agents and employees, upon information and belief,
5 transact business within this district, derive substantial
6 revenue from intrastate and interstate commerce and have
7 committed tortious acts, including copyright infringement,
8 within this district and also without this district having
9 injurious consequences within this district, and all
10 Defendants are otherwise within the jurisdiction of this
11 Court.

12 18. Upon information and belief, at some time
13 presently unknown, after UNICOLORS first published its
14 copyrighted design, Defendants, and each of them, willfully
15 infringed UNICOLORS' copyright in the Design by causing
16 infringing and unauthorized copies of the Design to be
17 manufactured, offering for sale, and sold, without
18 UNICOLORS' consent, apparel made with textiles imprinted
19 with works of art which were copied from UNICOLORS'
20 copyrighted Design.

21 19. Defendants' infringing design was clearly copied
22 from UNICOLORS' Design, and said copying was done without
23 UNICOLORS' authorization or consent.

24 20. The layout, colors, details, pattern repeats and
25 all other design elements of Defendants' infringing
26 textiles and garments made therefrom are all virtually the
27 same as the Design, and infringes UNICOLORS' copyrighted
28

1 Design.

2 21. UNICOLORS has no adequate remedy at law to
3 prevent further violation of the aforesaid copyright laws,
4 and therefore seeks relief as hereinafter requested.

5 22. UNICOLORS has also sustained and seeks damages,
6 including, but not limited to, reasonable attorney's fees
7 and costs of litigation, against Defendants according to
8 proof as hereinafter requested.

9 23. Defendants, in committing the wrongful acts
10 alleged herein, are guilty of fraud, oppression, or malice,
11 entitling Plaintiff to exemplary and punitive damages in an
12 amount appropriate to punish Defendants and make an example
13 of them to the community. Plaintiff, therefore prays that
14 punitive damages be awarded against Defendants, and each of
15 them, according to proof at time of trial.

16
17 **SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION**

18 (CONTRIBUTORY COPYRIGHT INFRINGEMENT)

19 (AS AGAINST ALL DEFENDANTS)

20 24. Plaintiff realleges and incorporates by reference
21 each and every allegation of Paragraphs 1 through 23 as
22 though fully set forth herein.

23 25. Before or after the date of filing for
24 registration of the subject copyright, and continuing to
25 date, SILHOUETTE, JANETTE and DOES 1 through 10 have
26 contributorily infringed UNICOLORS' Copyrighted Design by
27 inducing, causing or materially contributing to the

1 infringing conduct of a direct infringer.

2 26. On information and belief, said conduct by
3 Defendants was and is willfully done with knowledge of
4 UNICOLORS' Copyrighted Design, and/or was and is
5 negligently done.

6 27. UNICOLORS has no adequate remedy at law to
7 prevent further violation of the aforesaid copyright laws,
8 and therefore seeks relief as hereinafter requested.

9 28. UNICOLORS has also sustained and seeks damages,
10 including, but not limited to, statutory damages, and/or
11 actual damages, profits derived by the infringers from
12 their infringements of the Copyrighted Design, reasonable
13 attorney's fees and costs of litigation, against Defendants
14 according to proof as hereinafter requested.

15 29. Defendants, in committing the wrongful acts
16 alleged herein, are guilty of fraud, oppression, or malice,
17 entitling Plaintiff to exemplary and punitive damages in an
18 amount appropriate to punish Defendants and make an example
19 of them to the community. Plaintiff, therefore prays that
20 punitive damages be awarded against Defendants, and each of
21 them, according to proof at time of trial.

22 WHEREFORE, UNICOLORS demands judgment against
23 Defendants, and each of them, as follows:

24 a. That Defendants, and each of them, their
25 officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys and all
26 parties in active concert or participation with them be
27 enjoined from infringing UNICOLORS' copyrighted Design,

1 including, but not limited to, manufacturing, vending,
2 printing, distributing, selling, displaying, promoting, or
3 advertising fabric or garments or other products
4 incorporating a design copied from the copyrighted Design
5 or by causing and/or participating in manufacturing,
6 printing, vending, distributing, offering for sale,
7 selling, displaying, promoting, or advertising by others
8 pursuant to 17 U.S.C. Section 502.

9 b. That Defendants, and each of them, be enjoined to
10 deliver up for destruction, all infringing copies of
11 UNICOLORS' copyrighted Design in their possession or under
12 their control, whether in the form of fabric or apparel or
13 other products incorporating the infringing Design, to
14 withdraw all advertising or promotional materials,
15 including, but not limited to catalogs, bearing a copy of
16 such copyrighted Design, and print rollers, screens,
17 matrices, and the like utilized in the manufacture of
18 infringing textiles pursuant to 17 U.S.C. Section 503.


19 c. That Defendants, and each of them, be required to
20 pay UNICOLORS all damages UNICOLORS has sustained as a
21 consequence of their infringement of UNICOLORS' copyrighted
22 Design, including, but not limited to, statutory damages
23 under the Copyright Act, and that Defendants be required to
24 account to UNICOLORS for all gains, profits, and advantages
25 derived by them from their infringement of the Design,
26 including profits on all sales of fabrics, apparel, and
27 other goods embodying any elements of UNICOLORS'

1 copyrighted Design pursuant to 17 U.S.C. Section 504.

2 d. That Defendants, and each of them, be required to
3 pay to UNICOLORS their reasonable attorney's fees and costs
4 of suit of this action pursuant to 17 U.S.C. Section 505.

5 e. That Defendants, and each of them, be required to
6 pay to UNICOLORS exemplary and punitive damages in an
7 amount appropriate to punish Defendants and make an example
8 of them to the community, according to proof at time of
9 trial.


